
Dear Readers

MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Parishioner of the Year Award

The certificate is presented at the annual meeting for electors each year. Dear Editor

For many years the Alzheimer's Club went from strength to strength under the care of excellent staff, managed by community volunteers and supported by a fundraising group. The group raised a considerable amount of money with a lot of hard work, applying for grants and running events in the local area. About four years ago, the running of the Unit was taken over by the national Alzheimer's Society. The local group no longer had any influence .

Subsequently the Unit moved to Audlett Drive in Abingdon, charges were introduced and we were informed that all monies raised could no longer be restricted to the Unit but would go to Bucks, Berks and Oxon. Supporters were unable to specify that the money they donated would go to the Unit. However, the group continued with its fundraising activities.

At the end of May, the group was informed that the Unit was to close at the end of August due to fluctuating numbers. The members of the group were extremely upset at this decision.

The group would like to thank the people of Marcham and district who have over the years so generously supported the Club and the Unit. You have attended our fundraising sales, given your Christmas cards to be used both for therapy at the Unit and for recycling for sale. Oxford Flower club, provided money for armchairs by making the Unit their charity of the year and Oxford Inner Wheel gave money for the dining room chairs to have easy moving wheels fitted and local churches made regular donations. The benefits of all this goodwill and practical kindness to those in our neighbourhood and their carers who have had to cope with dementia at first hand have been real and tangible. Thank vou all so much.

MARCHAM SOCIETY REPORT MADE IN ABINGDON – ECHOES FROM THE SHOP FLOOR AT MG

On 14 November, Bob Frampton talked to the Marcham Society about the stories told to him by those who worked at "the Gs" as the factory was popularly known locally. These have been amalgamated into a book, which is due for publication in February 2018.

MG production began in Abingdon in 1929 and was an immediate success, building up a loyal workforce, often from the same families. Youngsters often joined the firm from school as tea boys and girls and worked their way up. During World War 2 the factory made engines for Lancaster bombers and wings for fighter aircraft, earning it a respectful fly-past by the RAF.

From the 1950s onwards, rallying became important at MG. Special teams acted as back-up for rallies such as the one from London to Mexico in 1970. They were away for many weeks at a time, making hair-raising journeys through challenging terrain. Back in Abingdon, wicked humour sometimes surfaced, such as the time when the workforce whistled the theme tune to Z-Cars* during a visit by a group of policemen. Fun was also had at the MG Social Club in Caldecott Road, which boasted a bar, ballroom and sports ground.

Golden jubilee celebrations were held in 1979, but a few days later it was announced that the factory was to close. Theories vary about the reasons, but the sense of sadness and betrayal is still felt 38 years on. MGs are now made at a specialist works in Steventon at a cost of \pounds 80,000 each. *JF*

CPR / DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

lan Jones of South Central Ambulance Service came to the school on 18 November to give training to enable us to use any of the THREE defibrillator machines (AEDs) in Marcham. He is a very engaging trainer and it was great to see him roll the Chair of the Parish Council around on the floor to get her in the recovery position! There were several dummies to test our CPR skills on, including one that lit up when we gave the correct amount of pressure to pump blood to the brain.

lan told us a useful acronym DRAB to help if we came across an emergency situation:

Assess the Danger Is the patient Responsive? Is the Airway clear? Are they Breathing?

But I think the most important thing he told us was to call 999 – even if you have to leave the patient to do so – and get help as quickly as possible. The operator on the phone will talk you through assessing the patient and if you need to use the Defibrillator.

There are THREE Defibrillators in the village, one outside the shop, one outside the school and one inside Denman College – so you will never be far away from one if it is needed.

The Clerk may arrange further training if there are enough people who would like to learn more about CPR – see page 3 for details.

Can ambulance and emergency crews see your house number at night?

Lives are at risk because emergency crews cannot see house numbers and property names easily. As illness and injuries can occur at any time, make sure your house name or number is clearly visible from the road by day and night, so that, when you need them most, they can find you quickly and easily.

- Check your house name or number is visible from the road
- Make sure that there are no trees or bushes obstructing the sign
- Switch on, when possible, an outside light.

It is essential that when the emergency services are called they can find the address as quickly and as easily as possible.

REPRESENTATIVES' REPORTS

MARCHAM & DISTRICT NEWS

ED VAIZEY WRITES...

In October, I spoke in Parliament alongside my fellow Oxfordshire MPs about the future of healthcare in the county. Wantage Hospital is currently in a state of limbo - Oxford Health announced in April 2016 that they would be closing the hospital due to concerns over legionella in the old pipe system. This decision is subject to a consultation by Oxfordshire CCG - a consultation which was previously promised

in October 2016. Phase one of the consultation did not take place until January 2017, three months after the full consultation was promised. As Wantage is a community hospital it is not covered by this phase. Phase 2 of the consultation has yet to take place, and no date has been announced for when it will begin. This leaves the hospital effectively closed with no end in sight.

After an online petition was signed by almost 4,000 people it was agreed to keep the hospital's physiotherapy and maternity services open. However, Oxfordshire CCG re-tendered the hospital's physiotherapy services and the contract passed to HealthShare. The company has since had to close all physiotherapy services provided in Wantage, leaving the hospital with just limited maternity care. Whilst we all recognise the pressures on local health authorities, it is clear that the entire consultation process by Oxfordshire CCG has been completely unacceptable. We must have an open and transparent conversation about the services needed in our towns and communities and this should include full public and stakeholder engagement at every stage.

Also in October, the Communities Secretary Sajid Javid announced £2.5 million allocation funding for 9 garden towns across England. After a successful bid, I am delighted an additional £295,000 of capacity funding has been allocated to support the delivery of Didcot Garden Town in 2017/18. This additional funding is specifically for ongoing work on place-making, community engagement and the development of an arts and culture strategy. The Government recognises the important contribution the project will have on its central ambition of delivering more homes and I am pleased by the support for Didcot's ambitious, community-led plans for growth.

It is also worth noting that Public Health England and NHS England have now launched their Stay Well This Winter campaign, which helps the most vulnerable people prepare for winter and avoid having to visit hospital due to common winter illnesses. If you're in one of the groups who are particularly susceptible - such as pensioners and pregnant women - or the parent of a young child, go and speak to your GP or pharmacist as soon as possible to give yourself the best chance of avoiding flu this year. More people than ever before are eligible for that free vaccination this year, including more young children and everyone who works in care homes. To check if you or your loved ones are eligible, and for other tips on staying well this winter, head to: www.nhs.uk/staywell.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT **AIR QUALITY**

No more talk and much more management please

For many years, concerns over Air Quality were confined to our largest cities. The Clean Air Acts of the 1950s solved (or at least reduced) the scale of the problem in those cities. As the impact of more and more cars and HGVs on our Air Quality began to be felt, concern spread way beyond the traditional centres of industrial smog. Not only does the centre of Oxford (one of the nation's smaller cities) now have a generally accepted problem of poor air quality, the problems are being felt in towns and villages all across the County. In our immediate area alone, Botley, Abingdon and Marcham have "Air Quality Management Areas" where NOX gas levels breach European safety limits. Several other areas are likely to join them in the next few years. There is a growing awareness from Government at all levels that economic



growth must take some account of Air Quality. There is plenty of talk about electric cars, even electric HGVs, Clean Air Zones, better bus services and cycle lanes. There is also talk of just how many people's lives are being cut short by poor air quality.

The trouble is, it is just talk! Everyone knows something needs to be done. No-one seems quite sure how to set about it. Meanwhile, we build more and more houses, our roads become more and more congested and our health becomes more and more affected.

At this November's Full Council Meeting a motion was passed unanimously calling for urgent action. A Group of Councillors and officers from all Councils (District, City and County) is to be set up to come up with practical solutions to the County's Air Quality issues and instigate them as a matter of urgency. There will be some tough decisions to take including limits to which routes vehicles can take through the County - Clean Air Zones, HGV diversions, the refusal of planning developments where air quality solutions cannot be found and an end to the argument that a little more housing won't make much difference.

Above all, it will involve an end to the years of talking about the problem and an end to the trend of different groups (including politicians) attempting to make the Air Quality their own. The problem belongs to all of us - the environmentalists who truly care, the District Councils who are responsible for measuring Air Quality, the County Council which is responsible for traffic management and all levels of Government responsible for planning.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Below is a summary of my response to the Local Plan Part 2 consultation as it affects Marcham and Shippon.

Marcham

We are delighted that the Vale has finally taken full account of the AQMA running through Marcham and have removed 410 houses due to be built east of the village. These extra houses, they reasoned, would generate heavy traffic, which would in turn exacerbate the air quality to totally unacceptable levels in the AQMA. Why, we ask therefore, has the Vale seen fit to allow a further 90 houses to be built along the end of Packhorse Lane? Surely the argument NOT to build 410 houses also applies to the 90 houses, especially as nearby, Kingston Bagpuize continues to expand sending much of its west-east traffic through Marcham's AQMA.

Shippon, Dalton Barracks and Airfield

Shippon is a very small village with houses dating back to medieval days. The residents are proud of its history and the fact that it is partly protected by being in the Green Belt. So the LPP2 with its plans to swamp the village of Shippon, Dalton Barracks and the Airfield with 1,200 houses initially, with the likelihood of up to 5,000 houses eventually, has come as a very rude shock to them! To do this, the Vale has removed these areas from Green Belt and instead has placed Brownfield status on them so that they can legally build the houses. I have to congratulate the residents of Shippon for being so accommodating, and even joining with Wootton to form a joint Neighbourhood Plan. It therefore seems very disappointing of the Vale not to bend to Shippon's one request to keep the village in the Green Belt and so preserve some of its unique character. Therefore, we would ask the Vale to reconsider and to reinstate the village into the Green Belt, as they have done for Whitecross.

We are also concerned by the massive impact this development will have on the surrounding roads, especially as we understand that nothing much will happen to these roads with the first tranche of houses. It is essential that such a big development be supported by all necessary infrastructure, especially roads which are already heavily used.

Neighbourhood Team Newsletter for Marcham

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) Calls about ASB have dropped which is good news. However, I expect



this to pick up with Halloween trick or treaters going about the villages and Bonfire night coming up. I would like to ask parents to talk to their children before going out as the person behind that door may be elderly, vulnerable or very frightened. If you see a home in darkness please don't knock, also with fireworks please try to keep them to the 5th November as there are people in our community with PTSD and may be suffering as a result of miss use of fireworks. [*This was written for November but the advice applies all year round* - ED]

Fly Tipping

I have seen an increase in fly tipping in our area. Fly tipping is illegal and carries a fine of up to £20,000 (for trade waste) and it is the responsibility of the person getting rid of the waste to ensure that you are using a reputable company. If the Environmental Heath Team (EHO) finds any items that they can trace back to an individual or company, then further action will be taken. If you do not have the waste transfer receipts received when handing it over to the disposal company, it will be the original individual or company that gets fined.

Thefts from Vans

We have received increased reports of tools being stolen from vans across the area. I know it is not always easy if you have an early start or no secure storage but please do not leave tools in your van overnight if possible. Consider taking basic target hardening steps to reduce your chances of becoming a victim of this crime. Consider fitting CCTV or floodlights at your home and an alarm and extra locks on your vehicle.

Fireworks for Parties and New Year's Eve

• Fireworks can cause serious damage or injury if not used correctly, so always follow the instructions. Keep them away from property, trees, fences, bushes or vehicles and always stand a safe distance away when setting them off. An organised display is the best way to enjoy fireworks safely. If you do decide to have your own display remember:

- you must be over 18 to buy fireworks
- letting off a firework in a public place is an offence
- you are breaking the law if you let off fireworks between 11pm -7am (this is extended to midnight on Bonfire night)
- make sure fireworks conform to British Standards BS 7114, EN 14035 or EN 15947
- Remember not to forget your pets. Keep them safe indoors and make sure they have a comfortable, quiet space to relax in.

Crime Prevention Advice With Autumn upon us we are spending less time in our gardens and we are packing away lawn mowers, garden tools and push bikes. It is a good idea to take a look at your sheds and outbuildings and make sure they are in a good state of repair. You can fit anti-tamper screws to the hinges if they are on the outside, and investing in a good padlock should help reduce the shed break-ins.
