



MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Council Tax 2018

The Parish Council held its budget meeting in January to look at its expenditure for the next financial year. The precept request has been lodged with the Vale of White Horse District Council for £54,500. This is the amount charged via the council tax to the residents of the parish. This is an increase of £5,000 over what was given by the District Council last year, but the costs will be shared between a larger number of houses, as many of the latest houses on the new developments in the village have become occupied. The Parish Council will have important expenditure this next year, particularly in regards to the new village hall, and the planned acquisition of public open space on the Vanderbilt site, possible repointing of the war memorial, as well as awarding grants to local organisations.

Parishioner of the Year Award

Thank you to all of you who have taken the time and trouble to write to the Council to put forward nominations for the Parishioner of the Year Award. The Council has a working party that is now considering all the nominations in order to prepare a shortlist for the Council to consider in due course.

Recycling

Your chance to talk rubbish with the Councils in Oxfordshire. Consultation is being undertaken by Oxfordshire County Council regarding how it can help reduce the quantity of waste thrown away and increase recycling. The results will inform the review of the joint countywide waste strategy. This sets out priorities across Oxfordshire for waste and recycling until 2030. The agreed priorities will be approved by the Oxfordshire Environment Partnership and will be adopted by the relevant District Council later in the year. 



MARCHAM SOCIETY REPORT: THE ROMAN TEMPLE SITE AT TRENDLES: A VOLUNTEER'S VIEW

A large audience gathered in Marcham church on 9 January to hear Simon Blackmore give the Marcham Society's Annual Lecture. He described how the Trendles site was found and showed examples of Roman temples. A team of archaeologists from Oxford University excavated the site from 2001-11, with the enthusiastic support of the landowners, Will and Janey Cumber.

A Heritage Lottery grant funded the training of a group of volunteers to weigh, measure, number and note the finds. As there were 2,500 coins, 6,500 bones and 200 boxes of pottery, it is not surprising that this work took 5 years. 80% of the animal bones were from sheep, but there was a complete skeleton of a cow, nick-named Daisy. Coins from many centuries were found and there were examples of jewellery, shoes and even a basket. Much of the pottery was made in Oxford, but there were pieces from other parts of the country and even Samian ware from France. To end the evening, Simon and his helpers dispensed Mulsum (a Roman-style mulled wine) to the audience, just right for a chilly January evening. *JF*

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Please forgive yet another article on planning and development; I will try to find something else to write about in future. It may not be easy. The impact of Development on Drayton Road and its Neighbourhood Plan, the impact of development on the A415 through Marcham, Barrow Rd and the Marcham AQMA, the impact of development in Sutton Courtenay on Culham Bridge and the A34, itself already under extreme stress running through the middle of it all, it sometimes seems as if this County Division, of which we are all part, is being singled out for very special treatment. The truth is, of course, that many parts of the South of England are under similar stress.

However, with our very low unemployment and our local economy thriving, Government is wanting, expecting and depending on us to grow. For almost the first time, the stresses – particularly on our road system - are now so obvious and so acute that Government is realizing that without more infrastructure there are fewer and fewer sensible places to put the nation's much needed extra housing. Money has to be found and the calls for infrastructure before housing are becoming ever louder and more persuasive.

Hence, the "Growth Deal" - an initial "downpayment" (Government term, not mine) of £215m over 5 years, to help us cope with all the housing our Councils are already committed to - may not be enough, but it's a start. Given that our housing is due to be delivered over the next 13 years, it appears that, if the deal is signed, there is the prospect of some infrastructure before houses. This is something we have been requesting for many years now.

On January 23rd, a planning appeal hearing will have begun over two potential major developments in Sutton Courtenay. The OCC Highway Officer's view is that the road network will not cope, at least not until a new bridge over the Thames has been built. This might happen until five years' time at the earliest. The planning appeal is due to last at least 8 days, we are told. We will know if the Growth Deal is to be signed on February 1st. The timing of all this and the planning decision is going to be highly significant. The result, however it goes, will impact not just on Sutton Courtenay and the immediate villages around, but on the whole of Oxfordshire and almost certainly on planning in the whole of the South of England. I would urge all those with an interest in planning and housing to join me in watching the progress of that appeal very closely..

A Promotion?

After all the work we have done on air pollution issues in Marcham, I agreed to take on the shadow portfolio for Environmental and Housing at the Vale. You can imagine my gasp when I saw the long list of responsibilities it involves, including technical, licensing and safety services! Cllr Elaine Ware is the cabinet member, and the officer in charge has yet to be revealed. I hope to have regular meetings with the officer in charge to keep me up to scratch. So, once you have browsed through the list, please feel free to contact me on any issue you feel is in my remit.

The Vale of White Horse District Council provides the following services:

- Environmental services
- Collects and recycles domestic waste
- Cleans streets and public places
- Monitors atmospheric pollution, noise and contaminated land and investigates complaints
- Monitors the safety of bathing waters and private water supplies
- Enforces legislation concerning food safety, including food complaints and food poisoning
- Enforces legislation concerning health and safety at work, including accidents at work and complaints about working conditions
- Deals with a wide range of public health issues eg defective

- drainage, deposits of rubbish on private land, animal welfare, stray dogs, infectious disease control
- Carries out a range of licensing activities eg entertainment licensing, street trading consents, licences for ear piercing, acupuncture, tattooing and electrolysis

Housing Services

- Provides housing advice
- Manages the housing register
- Arranges for temporary accommodation for homeless clients
- Processes grant and loan applications including grants for disability adaptations to homes
- Promotes and provides advice on improving home efficiency
- Monitors, advises and enforces housing standards across the private sector (including park homes)
- Administers housing benefit and Council Tax benefit
- Identifies and takes steps to strive to meet the current and future housing needs of local residents
- Provides Closed Circuit Television Camera services
- Works in partnership on community safety issues

An Update on The Five Council Partnership?

In 2016, the Vale took a bold decision to share thirteen services (including corporate and professional services) with four other District Councils in a bid to save £50 million. The other District Councils are Hart DC, Mendip DC, Havant Borough Council (including some shared services with E. Hants), and South Oxfordshire DC. We have now been warned that this target will be missed by £30 million, which means that each council will only save £400,000 each year. This is better than nothing, but clearly disappointing.

Read Easy is expanding in Oxford!

Read Easy Oxford East is a local community group that supports adults with reading difficulties. Our trained volunteers provide one-to-one intensive coaching over a six to eighteen month period so that people can improve their reading skills. This



often helps them to transform their lives in other ways – they may be able to get a better job, sign up for further training, or start to read with their children and grandchildren. We also plan to offer an extension programme of further reading and writing activities tailored to the individual needs of each reader to enable them to move ahead with their lives.

Due to the success of our work, which began specifically in Blackbird Leys, we are now expanding to encompass the entire Oxford East parliamentary constituency. We will now be working in areas including Headington, Barton, Rose Hill, and Wood Farm, alongside our existing activities in Blackbird Leys. Anyone can refer themselves if they think they need help and many of our readers are referred to us through other agencies. We carry out an independent assessment and aim to match each reader with a suitable coach.

We do not employ any members of staff; all our coaches are volunteers, as are the coordinators and members of the management committee. We have to raise funds to buy the special reading manuals that are given to each reader, train and support the coaches, and reimburse expenses to the volunteer coordinators Chair Lynn Dowler says: 'We are still having young people leaving school without the literacy skills to play a full role in society and have full access to modern technology. Helping anyone of any age achieve the literacy skills necessary to enter the workplace, be good parents or grandparents and be involved in society is very worthwhile and rewarding. You can contribute by becoming a coach or by referring someone who needs our help to us. We are also looking for a volunteer to fill the important role of support coordinator.'

MCG latest update

Following up from the AGM and public meeting on 23rd November about MarchamCentre, the new community facilities, the new trustees of Marcham Community Group (MCG), which will operate the facilities, held their first meeting in January. One of the first actions was to set up the three committees that will run the facilities day to day: Hall Committee (which will be chaired by Chris Ricketts); Field Committee (chaired by Trevor Hill); and Finance and General Committee (chaired by Warren Brooker). Other trustees will be joining one or more of these committees and we are in the process of inviting other people in Marcham with appropriate skills and experience to join also.

If you feel you have skills and/or experience you think may be helpful, please contact Jim Asher (391727) or one of the committee chairs. For people new to Marcham, this might provide an early chance to become involved. If you have useful skills, but don't wish to be on a committee, we would like to be able to call on your help when needed, so please make contact.

We are also keen to recruit more members to help support our case for fund-raising to complete the new facilities. Please contact Jim Asher for details. Annual subscriptions are £5 (single) and £8 (family). The new trustees will work to move the project forward and will resolve remaining issues as we approach the start of work on the construction phase, after archaeology investigations due to start on 1st April.



You may have seen some temporary excavations in the field in mid-January (above); test holes were dug to establish ground conditions ahead of construction, and they were refilled when the survey was completed.

As previously announced, the existing MSSSC building will be closed and vacated on 31st March 2018 for site work to begin. Organisations who have used the facilities are making arrangements for temporary relocation elsewhere. Marcham PCC has been able to extend the lease on the Baptist Hall buildings for a further two years for continued community use. We are grateful to the Baptist Union Corporation for their help at this time. Anyone wishing to make a booking for the Baptist Hall should contact Tamsin Gilbert, email: info@allsaintsmarcham.org.

The Community Facilities Steering Group (CFSG) will continue to oversee the project and will look to MCG to keep everyone in Marcham updated regularly on the project.







Neighbourhood Team **Newsletter for Marcham** from Rich Osborn **Burglaries**



The Abingdon Outer Neighbourhood team along with the Investigation Hub have been carrying out high visibility patrols in the areas affected by the recent burglaries. Crime prevention advice has been given out and SmartWater kits have been sold.

What is SmartWater?

Smartwater is a brand of forensic marking fluid containing millions of microscopic particles that make up an individual property identification code. The liquid is invisible to the naked eye, but glows green under UV light. It can be painted onto valuable items (e.g. laptops, MP3 players, televisions, antiques) so that if the items are stolen and later seized by the police, the markings can be checked and items linked with their owners. ABINGDON COUNTRY MARKET HAS MOVED!


The Market will now take place on the the 2nd Saturday of the month from 10am to 12 midday at The Salvation Army Hall in West St Helens Street.

Report from GARD - January 2018

Thames Water announcement expected 'soon'



2019-2024 (dWRMP19, as it is known for short) for public consultation. However, on Friday 5th January, we were informed by Thames Water that the release would be delayed until 'end of January' (which is unfortunately after the deadline for this newsletter).

The reason given is that the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) have not yet cleared the draft reports to go out for consultation. By the Government's rules, DEFRA have to check the draft reports for 'National Security' and 'Commercially confidential' issues before release to the public for comment. This has taken longer than usual, probably because DEFRA are very heavily involved in BREXIT issues - we do not suspect anything underhand in this delay. Anyway, we await the issue of the draft so that we can comment.

Once the dWRMP19 is released, the public (and the regulator bodies such as the Environment Agency and OFWAT) have 12 weeks to submit comments. Thames Water then have a further period to respond to all the comments, and release a revised draft for the Government to approve. We are likely to reach the revised draft stage in the Autumn.

GARD's work during the consultation

The next few months are extremely important for the opposition to Thames Water's reservoir plans, so we urge everyone to look and comment on these (we will be giving information about how to do this). We are not sure exactly where the reservoir fits in Thames Water's plans, but we are sure from their briefings that they have not abandoned the idea – and, however it is mentioned, whether to be built in the next 5 years or the next 15, strong opposition at this stage is essential to get the idea ditched, or kicked so far down the road that it will essentially die as an option.

GARD will:

- look through the proposals in detail, using our expert consultant's help;
- press for more action on Leakage and Water Efficiency (we already know from briefings that Thames Water's proposals on these will be completely inadequate);
- work with CPRE to expose the faulty logic in Thames Water's predictions of the water shortage in the South East (this depends heavily on dubious population growth predictions);
- brief local Parish Councils and the Vale of the White Horse DC on our findings, and press them to put in opposing criticism on the reservoir plans;
- keep everyone informed through our website and Facebook pages, and, if the situation is urgent, lobby the local MPs;
- continue to lobby the Environment Agency and OFWAT about the fact that the reservoir will not be resilient against long droughts and is not environmentally the best solution;
- submit our final report to the consultation at the end of April.

GARD intends to call public meetings in the villages at the end of February/ beginning of March, to inform residents on the plans - please keep an eye out for information on these.

Joining GARD

Once again, thanks to all those who have recently joined GARD, and to existing members who have sent donations into our fighting fund. Our numbers continue to grow, but we still need your support.

As we have said previously, part of Thames Water's game is to try and reach a selected number of consumers (most of whom will not be local – so that they can be sold a biassed view of the reservoir) to try to show to OFWAT that they have 'public support' for the reservoir. This is a numbers game, and we need to show we have large numbers of consumers on our side. It is thus important to like our Facebook page (www.facebook.com/abingdonreservoir), and above all, to join GARD if you oppose the reservoir.


