

MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Council Tax 2019/20

The Parish Council has now considered the budget for the next financial year. It is requesting £63300 from the Vale of White Horse District Council to help with the costs of the parish. The parish element of the Council tax is currently £69.70 per band D property. This will rise slightly by £2.07 per annum next year. The budget can be found on the Council's website www. marchamparishcouncil.gov.uk. As well as needing to undertake regular maintenance and repairs within the village, the Council has set aside funds for a possible parish election in May when the next elections will be held, and has put aside a sum of £20,000 for consultant and surveyors fees, mainly in connection with the construction of the new community facilities.

Parish Councillor Jane Fabes

Jane Fabes who was co-opted in July 2016 has offered her resignation as a councillor,. This is the second time that Jane has served the parish on the Council and the Council's thanks go to her for her support, helpful advice and input into what has been a very busy time over the last 2½ years.

The Council has decided not seek an immediate replacement, as Parish Council elections will be held in May, and a new Council will be formed.

Parishioner of the Year Award

Thank you to all of you who have taken the time and trouble to write to the Council to put forward nominations for the Parishioner of the Year Award. The Council has a working party that is now considering all the nominations in order to prepare a shortlist for the Council to consider in due course.

Street Lighting

There are a considerable number of street lights in the village that are not coming on. This relates to late afternoon and during the evening, and not to those which the County Council turns off overnight. A check has been made of these by going round the village and noting each malfunctioning light. A list has been sent to the County Council with a request that they are repaired.

Marcham Parish Council - Internal Audit

The Council's internal auditor is retiring, and the Parish Council will soon be in need of a replacement. If there is anyone locally who is interested in taking on this role, then please contact the clerk for further information as to what is required.

MARCHAM SOCIETY REPORT, 8 January 2019 The work of Wild Oxfordshire, Sian Liwicki

On 8 January, the Marcham Society welcomed Sian Liwicki to give the Annual Lecture. Sian is well-known as co-owner of Bothy Vineyard, which also hosts the very popular Sculpture in the Vineyard exhibitions. Less well-known is her role as Chairman of Oxfordshire Wildlife. This organisation helps groups and individuals to co-operate and understand each other in order to sustain the county's wildlife, often through meetings or open events.

Oxfordshire Wildlife encourages landowners, community groups and individuals to provide good habitats, ranging from slightly-less-tidy farming practices to transforming waste ground into a wild flower meadow. As part of the Natural Flood Management Scheme, the organisation helped produce meanders and overspill ponds to slow river flow in the River Evenlode catchment area. They also help support ten Jubilee Wildlife Spaces (265 hectares in all).

Report from GARD - January 2019 The Next Steps in opposing the Thames Water





this will shortly be available on our website (www.gard-oxon.org. <u>uk</u>). Most importantly however, there was a very strong opposition response from local residents, local campaigning organisations and local political representatives at all levels. The proposal by Thames Water to bring forward the construction of the 'Abingdon' Reservoir to start in 2025 is overwhelmingly opposed by local campaign groups and councils, and universally in the locality there has been a call for a Public Inquiry into the plan.

The large majority of the Parish Councils in the area have issued formal responses opposing the plans and all called for a Public Inquiry. This call for a Public Inquiry is supported by the Vale of the White Horse DC, who state that they are not convinced by the Thames Water case, and by Oxfordshire County Council, whose response formally objects to the plan. CPRE Oxfordshire and the Wantage and Grove Campaign Group are also opposed to the plans. We must hope that Thames Water will listen to the opposition, but their past record does not give much confidence. That is why it has been important that our local MPs, Ed Vaizey (Wantage) and Layla Moran (Abingdon and Oxford West) have called for a Public Inquiry and written to Secretary of State, Michael Gove requesting this. We would like to thank them for their support, and also thank local

councillors, such as Mike Fox-Davies (Steventon and Hendred) and Richard Webber (Drayton and Sutton Courtenay) for their hard work in pushing the message and actions through the County Council.

Thanks also to those who wrote individually to the consultation opposing the plans and calling for a Public Inquiry. This time round there were a very large number of individual contributions, many of them copied personally to me, and featuring many forceful and thoughtful arguments. We now await to see Thames Water's response. If you wrote in, you will get an individual answer from them. If you find any of the answers are dismissive or evasive, we would be very pleased if you could share them with us (via email gard.chair@gmail.com), and complain to your MP.

The next step will be for Thames Water's new partner in the reservoir plan (Affinity Water) to publish their revised draft plan. This is expected in March. We will be responding to this, and we hope to co-ordinate our response with local organisations, and that you will all write to Affinity expressing your opposition. Affinity are 'new kids on the block' as far as the reservoir is concerned, and they have said they are keen to engage with our local concerns and hear them. They are less wedded to the reservoir plan as a solution than Thames Water, for whom it seems to have become some sort of sacred cow. In spite of Thames Water claiming that the reservoir will be needed by the 'South-east in general', Affinity Water (who supply Hertfordshire) are the only prospective water company customer to express any interest. Other SE water companies (South-east Water and Southern Water) have already withdrawn their requests for future supply from Thames Water. The analysis by GARD shows that the requirements of Affinity can be met by very simple and cheap schemes and improving leakage (sounds familiar?), until at least the 2060s. Once again the reasons advanced by Thames Water do not stack up, and Oxfordshire needs to convince Affinity that much cheaper and more quickly deliverable solutions are available for their customers.

Please keep an eye out and respond to Affinity's plan when published. **Joining GARD**

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT NO DEAL – NO PROBLEM – NO WAY?

In the past few weeks, I have had a moral dilemma. Brexit is not a subject for local government or its representatives, and given the divisive nature of the subject, I have tried to steer well clear. The problem I face is that, as a leader of a political group on Oxfordshire County Council, I have been given briefings from officers charged by government with investigating and assessing the potential impact of a "No Deal" outcome on Oxfordshire and its residents. As a wealthy, thriving County, the risks to Oxfordshire are overall deemed to be low compared to many other parts of the country. However, I have been told that there are real concerns over certain possible impacts. I am also instructed that all such information should be kept confidential. I am told that the reason for confidentiality is that we must not cause panic buying or queueing. But if we wind up with a "No Deal" conclusion, there might indeed be some panic. Indeed, I am aware of residents in my patch who have already stockpiled some food and medicines. I would argue that knowledge of the risks involved with "No Deal", and allowing that knowledge to be part of the argument now, would in reality reduce the risk of panic.

I am well aware that some people will argue that what I have to say is simply one more manifestation of "Project Fear". Or is it "Project Reality"? I have wrestled with that for some time.

I believe that the information I have been given is both independent and a fair assessments of the risks. I have to try to balance my duty to those Oxfordshire residents who elected me against the Government instruction to respect confidentiality. Should I keep quiet and just hope that "No Deal" is rejected as an option anyway, or should I demand that such information be put out there as part of the conversation *now*, where it may influence people's opinions? What would I say to the residents who elected me when, in the event of a "No Deal" conclusion, I am challenged with "*You knew there was a risk of this and didn't tell us*?"

I am not willing to stay silent for long, but would welcome any constructive suggestions in the meantime.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

The Council's headquarters on the move again!

A move of the headquarters of the Vale with South is on the cards again. Why? Where is it going? Is the new site the best place for the residents it serves? Before answering these questions, I thought I would give you a brief rundown of the history of the Vale Headquarters.

In the 1990s, Abbey House in Abingdon was bought by the Conservative-run council, using money from the sale of council houses, and became the new Vale headquarters. It was a good place for the council, as a third of the population of the Vale is in Abingdon and nearly half is within 5 miles of Abingdon, so access for residents was easy.

In 2007, under a Lib Dem administration, in a money-saving bid, it was decided to share services and officers with South Oxfordshire – some would operate from Abbey House and some from Crowmarsh Gifford.

In 2012, under a Conservative administration, in another moneysaving bid, it was decided to move most of the council to Crowmarsh Gifford, in the heart of South Oxfordshire, leaving a skeleton staff in Abbey House. Over the years, the number of officers had reduced and only filled a proportion of Abbey House, so it was argued that to move to the South and to rent out most of Abbey House to the County Council, who was looking for a base for their overspill, was thrifty. However, this proved very

unpopular amongst Vale residents as it meant a round journey of nearly 25 miles for Abingdon residents and Councillors to visit the Council and nearly 17 miles for Didcot residents. Furthermore, as there is no bus service, residents would have to dig deep in their pockets to travel there or to depend on kind friends for car lifts.

In 2015, the Council offices in Crowmarsh Gifford were burnt down, so an urgent decision was made to house the offices at 135 Eastern Avenue, Milton Business Park. Fortuitously, this proved a popular move for the officers and residents of the Vale because of its easy access and favourable rent agreement. But this agreement is to come to an end in 2019, and the rent will increase steeply. A hunt for alternatives began, but nothing seemed to fit the bill. We are told that a move back to renting a new-build in Crowmarsh Gifford on land owned by SODC is the cheapest option.

This move to a purpose-built building may seem very attractive for the officers and those living near Crowmarsh Gifford, but for Vale residents and councillors, it has all the disadvantages of inaccessibility, as I have already highlighted. And there are no plans as yet to have any place in Abingdon or Milton or Didcot for a skeleton staff or for meetings. The Vale finances are under pressure at the moment and it may be that the need to save money will win the day. But have the administration thought creatively enough? I leave it to you to reach your own conclusion.

Burglary We are still receiving reports of burglaries in our area. We have been running Operation Monitor for six months (our operation to combat dwelling burglary) and reports show that in a large proportion of our burglaries suspects have gained entry to properties through insecure doors and windows. Access to the rear of properties has also been made easy by insecure side/rear gates. Are you making it easy for burglars? Please review your security, make sure that all of your windows and doors are locked before going to bed or going out. Lock your cars and keep keys away from doors and windows. Fit a lock on any gates and sheds and install security lighting and CCTV. If you would like any further advice please email the team using details at the bottom of the page..

Scams Scam calls continue to be a concern in our area and thankfully most of the recipients of these calls are able to avoid becoming a victim. We understand that these fraudsters can be very convincing and generally target the more vulnerable residents but our best tool for tackling this issue is knowledge. Here are some basic tips for how to avoid becoming a victim to these scams;

- No company should require your bank or card details over the phone, especially your PIN number. These details are only required when making a purchase or placing an order.
- No bank or authorities (Police, HMRC etc.) will call you to ask for personal or banking details
- If residents have any concerns regarding calls or messages they have received and think they may be being targeted by a scam, please do not hesitate to call the local team on 101. Better to be safe than sorry.

New Deputy Commander Chief Inspector Matthew Bullivant has been appointed as the new Deputy Commander for the South & Vale Local Policing Area (LPA).

He started his role on Tuesday 1 January, taking over from Chief Inspector Robert Murray who has returned to Reading to lead a team as an Emergency Response Team Inspector. On his new appointment, Chief Inspector Bullivant said: "I am really looking

forward to returning to South & Vale in my new role as Deputy Commander. I will be doing all I can to support our officers, staff and volunteers to ensure our communities remain a safe place to live and work.

"I plan to build on existing relationships in the local community and form new ones to empower and inform residents about both the work of the police and what can be done locally to help prevent crime. I will also look to further improve the effectiveness of the deployment of officers to the crimes that most affect the many different communities of South & Vale."

Offenders brought to Justice

- On 23rd December a group of males sat in a car on St Marys Green, smelling of cannabis. All four males were detained and stop searched, and one was found with a small amount of cannabis, a street caution was issued.
- On 31st December a man was arrested after he came to the attention of our roads policing officers in Marcham Road. The man decided he didn't want to wait and speak to officers and ran off. The man was quickly found and arrested. He has subsequently been charged with three offences, 'Taking a vehicle without consent', 'Driving whilst disqualified' and 'Driving without insurance'.
- Jason Tampin, age 37, was remanded in custody over the Christmas period after being charged with a number of offences in the Abingdon town area. The charges, including drugs offences, possession of an offensive weapon and several breaches of a Criminal Behaviour Order will be heard on 10/01/19. Tampin has been responsible for a great deal of antisocial behaviour in the town over the past year and so it is a great result to finally bring him to justice.
- Philip Knowles was also remanded in December, again as a result of a number of offences. Knowles was charged with several public order offences, as well as drugs & weapons offences and also two assaults including one on a police officer. Knowles will be in court for these offences on 17/01/19
- On 9th January a man was arrested for a burglary in Drayton that occurred on the 21st 22nd December. More details will follow..
