




Dear Readers

MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL **Christmas Tree Recycling**

A reminder for those of you who have real Christmas trees, and are not signed up to the District Council's garden waste service. Please take your tree to the square of tarmac which was the former bottle bank site, next to the Salvation Army textile bank, in Howard Cornish Road opposite Duffield Place, when you no longer need them. All real trees should be placed there by the end of the day on Wednesday 8th January 2020 for collection the next day. The Vale of White Horse District Council will collect these and arrange for recycling.

Council Tax 2020/21

The Parish Council will be carefully considering the budget for 2020/21 at its meeting to be held on 8th January. Once finalised, the Council will set the amount of council tax that comes to the parish from the total amount paid by residents to the Vale of White Horse District Council.

Bad weather can bring chaos to businesses, travel delays, school closures etc, but also affects those who are unable to get out. Do please check on your neighbours, make sure they are all right, and see whether they need assistance with anything.

This will be partly to fit in with other hall users, and dependent on when the hall is available. Look out for future announcements as to Council meeting dates in due course.

Estate Agent Sign Boards

The Council has received comments that estate agent 'For Sale' sign boards are being erected in locations well away from the properties to which they relate. Planning consent is required for certain types of advertising, and the Council will be writing to the planning authority as well as the estate agent firms direct, to see whether they can be removed.
