





MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL Former Parish Councillor -**Christine Ricketts**

It was with great sadness that the Council learned of the passing of former Parish Councillor Christine Ricketts. She had served on the Council for several years in the 1990s and early 2000s, and was respected by her colleagues, not only for her work on the Council but for the many other roles she undertook in the parish. She will be greatly missed by everyone.

Council Tax 2020/21

The Parish Council, at its last meeting, considered the budget for the next financial year, from 1st April, 2020. It is requesting £67,600 from the Vale of White Horse District Council to help with the costs of the parish. This sum is shared between the council tax paying properties in the parish. This element of the Council Tax is currently £71.77 per band D property. This will rise slightly by an increase in the region of £1.78 next year making the amount payable £73.55 The budget can be found on the Council's website www.marchamparishcouncil.gov.uk. As well as needing to undertake regular maintenance, and grass cutting within the village, the Council has set aside funds for consultant's fees in regards to the construction of the community facilities. Whilst the hall should be complete, there will be the monitoring of the construction of the multi-use games area, and legal work

The Council continued to object to the application, as the amendments did not resolve all the concerns previously raised by the Council.





Membership

MCG was deeply saddened to hear of the tragic loss of Chris Ricketts. She played such a key role in MCG as a dynamic trustee and as chair of the Hall Committee, and in many other village activities over many years, from Playgroup, Pre-School and Cubs to the Village Shop and the community minibus, to name just a few. Chris touched the lives of so many people in Marcham over the years and will be hugely missed.

We were delighted that Sponsor-a-Brick, run by the shop volunteers, passed the £3,000 mark in late December—this was Chris Ricketts' idea and she made it work. It is currently standing at over £3.100.

We are pleased to announce that we have been awarded a grant of £9701 from the VoWH New Homes Bonus grant scheme towards the purchase of new chairs and tables for the new hall. Along with other fund-raising, the total raised for furniture and fittings has now reached £37,000. We have still a gap to close, but we are moving in the right direction.



Building progress

Our new village hall building continues to make progress to plan, as internal work moves on. The earth mound is being shifted away and the old nursery building will be removed in late January.

Work will start soon on grading the playing field for the new pitch positions. During this time large areas of the field will be fenced off over several months for ground work and grass-seeding. It will still be possible to

cross the field. We hope that regular field walkers will be patient over this time.



CITIZENS ADVICE CAN HELP YOU THROUGH RELATIONSHIP BREAKDOWN

There is no storm quite like an emotional storm, and the trauma of a separation from a loved one can be devastating and overwhelming. Some people say it feels as if the ground is falling away beneath their feet. It



helps if you know there's somewhere you can go right away for help: Citizens Advice.

If you and your partner or spouse have decided that separation is inevitable, you should try to work out the practical details between yourselves. But bear in mind that you might eventually need to consult a solicitor as well to enshrine your agreement in law, especially if you have assets or children. Going to court should be regarded as a last resort.

Discuss with your ex-partner where you will live, where your children will live, and how to split any money or belongings. If you and your partner are too upset to talk to each other calmly, wait and talk later, or use a mediator.

If your partner makes you feel threatened, get help. Call Refuge or Women's Aid on 0808 2000 247. There is also a Men's Advice Line on 0808 801 0327.

If you have children with your partner, you are both responsible for the cost of looking after them when you separate, even if you are not married. The parent who moves out might have to pay maintenance to the parent who looks after the children.

Consider any outstanding debts or loans that you might have, and think about who needs to be informed about the separation. If you pay council tax, or receive benefits or tax credits, get in touch with the relevant people and tell them about your new status.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

As you will all be very aware, the climate emergency has become of paramount importance to the whole world. We are told by three global agencies- Nasa, Noaa and the UK Met- that the last 10 years, to the end of 2019, have been confirmed as the warmest decade on record. Indeed, last year was the second warmest on record dating back to 1850, 2016 being the warmest. Last year also saw two major heat waves hit Europe in June and July with a new national record of 46° C set in France on 28th June. New records were also set in Germany, the Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg and in the UK at 38.7C. In Australia the mean summer temperature was the highest on record by almost a degree. Now parts of Australia are beset by terrifying, spontaneous fires reminiscent of those in California last year. So it is vital that every country recognises this emergency and does something about it.

I am spending a few weeks in California (where my daughter and her husband live and who are about to have their first baby), and I have been struck by the progress it has made on putting in procedures to mitigate against global warming and the strong policies it has implemented. For example:

1) Planning policies

- all new builds have to be built to zero carbon footprint. So no gas is permitted....only electric is used.
- solar panels or solar windows or solar tiles have to be installed so that each new house provides enough electricity for itself throughout the year.
- rainwater tanks are installed below ground to collect grey water from gutters for the gardens, car washing etc
- instant hot water systems are used instead of hot water tanks.
- most houses are factory built to zero carbon levels.

2) Transport changes

- strong incentives are put forward to encourage people to buy electric cars
- retail businesses have to install electric chargers. To encourage shoppers to use their business, free electric charging is often offered
- utility companies offer a year's worth of free power if you buy an electric car
- electric scooters and golf carts are provided in cities (rather like Santander Cycles in London), where the average journey in the US is under 2 miles.
- 3) **Recycling** has become a major industry and new laws are being put in like the abolishment of one-use plastic.

4) **Technical advances** continue to be made.

At the Vale, the Planning Department is working hard to devise as many good strong policies as it can in its new Local Plan, with the help and support of all departments and the new Climate Emergency Committee. Unfortunately, it takes roughly 4 years to make a new Local Plan and so 4 years before we can implement new policies. We are looking at other possible ways of introducing policies earlier by, for example, tweaking SPDs (supplementary planning documents) and such like. As Greta Thunberg has been trying to warn us, all institutions like District Councils must recognise the signs of Climate Change and act now!

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

2019 was, for many of us, a tumultuous year. With District Elections in early May, Euro Elections (remember those?) in late May, and a General Election in December – Brenda from Bristol was not on her own. Hopefully, 2020 will be an opportunity for things to settle down – nationally, at least.

On the local front, the year presents at least three main challenges

and uncertainties. The first is, of course, Council budgets. For the first time in many years, the Oxfordshire County Council budget has a reasonably healthy look with no major cuts on the horizon. It may be that the Councillor Priority Fund (£15K to each Council Division) is a drop in the ocean of the overall £500m+ budget, but it is very good news that it is to be continued for another year. Doubtless there will be arguments over how any spare money should be spent, but that there should be any to spend is something of a novelty.

The VWHDC Budget does not, as expected, present such a happy picture. Many years of failing to raise District Council tax in line with most other Councils, together with an over-reliance on New Homes Bonus, and a reduction in business rate contribution, has produced a perfect storm facing the new administration. VWHDC is not alone with such problems. As a result, Unitary Local Government is very much back on the table. Nobody wants a repeat of the Northamptonshire debacle.

The second major challenge for 2020 is our local planning and infrastructure. The government drive for growth in Oxfordshire has put enormous pressure on our infrastructure - particularly our road system. Promises of government money have depended on Local Plans being in place. Understandably, residents want infrastructure before more housing. With the possibility of a change in focus to infrastructure in the North of England, we wait to see the impact on our area. There is no doubt that the proposed road from Didcot over the Thames is an essential part of future growth in our area – without it, the local road system will not take any more housing. The third challenge, and the most important, is the Environment.

Whilst everyone knows that it is changes in China, India and the US which will make the big difference, the UK and Oxfordshire should be demonstrating what can be done to reduce carbon output. This means changes in building and planning policies. Changes in what we eat, what we wear, and how we travel. There are growing signs that these things can be achieved without damaging our economic growth.

My family has an end of year game in which we each put into a box 3 predictions for the next year – one national, one local and one for the family. The box is opened at the end of the year. Not many of us got much right for 2019. But that will not stop me from wishing everyone a Very Happy 2020.

Abingdon Reservoir – Latest News from GARD

Ofwat has published its response to the water companies' plans. The bottom line is that Ofwat remains unconvinced by the proposals and now requires the companies to work on a study to inform fresh plans for water resources across



the south-east. They are also demanding much more effort on leakage reduction. The companies now have three years to complete the study and publish their findings.

This does not mean that the reservoir is off the table. It remains a threat to our area. However, it will be judged alongside other schemes, such as Severn-Thames water transfer, long advocated by GARD.

Ofwat are allowing £450 million for this study. This colossal sum will be raised from customers' bills. We all have an interest and duty to see that it is spent wisely and that the study won't be manipulated to rubber stamp the plans of private investors in the water companies.

It is clear that Ofwat have been listening to the views of local communities and other stakeholders. We need to ensure that this continues to be the case. GARD is working now to ensure that all of the local councils affected by the reservoir proposal work together to coordinate their objections. Acting together, we will be stronger. In the meantime, thanks to a generous donation from a local trust, we will be commissioning a Flooding Risk Study of the reservoir project.

What's available?

- Local pharmacies can give advice on several conditions, such as coughs, headaches, upset stomachs and skin conditions, as well as advise on stopping coughs and colds from getting worse.
- NHS 111 has call handlers who can help you choose the right health services for your needs, as well as a website.
 NHS 111 can put you in touch with a clinician, a GP, book you an appointment at your nearest minor injuries unit.
 You can also use NHS 111 online 111.nhs.uk
- Minor injuries units can treat deep cuts, small burns, sprains, sports injuries, and infected wounds. To find out your nearest MIU please visit the Oxford Health website
- Your local GP may offer extended opening hours into the evening or at the weekend.

Most importantly, only attend Emergency Departments when there is a genuine emergency, such as loss of consciousness, suspected heart attack or stroke, severe breathing difficulties, or severe bleeding that cannot be stopped.

Dear Friends,

Many of us in our community have been shocked and deeply affected by the sad news of dear Chris. Ricketts' death several weeks ago. Chris had a deep concern for village life and for people and in so many ways this concern was expressed in caring and practical action, here and overseas. Her involvement in the village shop and as a trustee of the Marcham Community Group were both illustrative of her heart for the community. It was Chris who suggested the sponsor-a-brick initiative for the new community building, which has been so successful, and she headed up the Hall Committee for the new building. Her leadership of Cubs and our uniformed organisations, were illustrative of her heart for young people. Her death leaves a big hole, not only in the lives of her family, but at the heart of Marcham. The funeral service takes place in All Saints' on Saturday February 1st at 11.30am.

Sudden and unexpected death comes as a jolt to all of us. In many ways such incidents come as a 'wake up call' to us. Life is fragile and at times, hard and deals a curve ball, which we might find hard to cope with. Such occasions remind us of how important human relations are, and friendships in particular.

The reaction of Martha to the death of her brother [John chapter 11] is such a natural and normal reaction of so many of us: "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died!" We so often cry out to God in these times "God, where are you? If only you had been here." The natural and normal expressions of grief kick in, and we question the faith that may have so often been a source of comfort, help and inner strength.

The most profound unfolding of that particular incident in Jesus' life, includes two important elements: firstly, that Jesus sobbed at the news of his friend's death. I find this both comforting and amazing. Christian faith believes that Jesus is God [the Son of God], and here he is sobbing at the death of someone he cared for and loved. He enters into grief and allows that loss to move him deeply. It means that he enters into our griefs and bereavements with us, shares our tears, and understands how we are affected by the deaths of those close to us.

Secondly, Jesus asks Martha a searching question: "I am the resurrection and the life. Anyone who believes in me will live, even after dying. ... Do you believe this, Martha?" Jesus offers us real hope beyond the grave. He is the one who offers us life after death, and his own resurrection underlined and proved that. Martha's answer is "Yes, Lord ... I have always believed you are the Messiah, the Son of God ..." I share that trusting faith, even though the actual grief processes can be both painful and distressing.

So, dear Friends, as we walk through the valley of the shadow of Chris's death, may I encourage us to hold on in faith to the promises of Christ, for He is with us, to guide, give comfort, and courage in the present, and to help us look to higher and brighter horizons that lie beyond the gate of death.
