MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL Annual Meeting of Electors

In light of government recommendations, and the restrictions on gatherings to help ensure public safety, the annual meeting of electors will not take place on Thursday 21st May as planned. The Parish Council will keep the situation under review, as it may be possible to arrange such a meeting much later in the year.

Parish Council Meetings

New legislation passed by government has allowed parish councils to continue to meet virtually, rather than having to meet in person. The Council held its first virtual meeting in April. Access for the public to observe is maintained in the same way as previously. Information for each monthly meeting will be on the Council's website.

Covid 19 – Support from volunteers

The Parish Council would offer a huge thank you to the volunteers who initiated the support group within the parish, and all those who have come forward to offer assistance where required, including the initiative from the Church, and MADNews which has published all the relevant contact information needed. Many people would be struggling were it not for the available support. It is good to know that Marcham is such a community minded village.

Salvation Army Textile Bin – Howard Cornish Road

The Salvation Army has temporarily closed the textile bank in Howard Cornish Road, as it is unable to collect the donations of clothes which are usually left there. The textile bank is currently full, so please do not leave plastic sacks alongside on the ground. Please keep your items at home until the collections can commence again.

Play Area – Anson Field

The play area is closed. This was initially due to the preparation of the new pitch area, but is also due to the coronavirus situation, it remains closed and is behind the Heras fencing with no public access. **Dog Waste Bin – Anson Field – off the**

path near Baptist Church

The dog waste bin off the path rear of the Baptist Church is behind the Heras fencing. This bin is not currently being emptied, so please do not throw your dog waste bags over the fence. Dog waste can be placed in your domestic black waste wheelie bin at home. If there is no accessible dog waste bin lined with a blue sack in the area where you walk your dog, then please take the waste home for disposal.

Dear Editor

Amongst all else that is going on, we should not forget that this is the 75th anniversary year of the end of World War 2. On the 8th May 1945 the War in Europe ended and on 15th August 1945 the War in the Far East ended. In that War, four people from Marcham died and are remembered on our memorials. This letter is to remember those four and to ask if anyone has more information that we can use to record for posterity in our village as much as possible about their lives.

The first to die was Dennis Lawrence. He died in India on 7th October 1943 in India. In 1939, he had been a Grocer's Errand Boy living in The Gap with his parents, James and Louisa. Dennis married Lilian Walters in April 1942. The Lawrence family had a long connection with Marcham. James Lawrence had been born here in 1885. James and his wife were living in Parkside in 1960.

Peter Bennett was killed over Holland on 25th April 1944, age 20, while serving as the pilot of a Lancaster bomber. His father had worked in Rio de Janiero (and Peter Bennett may have been born there). Peter Bennett was educated at Dauntsey's School in Wiltshire. In 1939 his family was living at Long Acre, Frilford.

Harry Dore was killed in Normandy on the 18th August 944 while serving as a Lance-Corporal with the Queens Regiment in the 7th Armoured Division. He had been born in Chipping Norton. In 1939, his parents were living at Manor Farm Cottages, Garford. Harry Dore had had a long war starting at Dunkirk, through Alamein, until he landed in Normandy.

The fourth, and last to die was Stephen Thorp Cooper on 27th April 1945 in Burma. He was serving with the Queen Victoria's Own Madras Sappers and Miners in the Indian Army. His connection with Marcham comes through his father, a Civil Engineer, who had been working for the Air Ministry, possibly being based at Marcham Park with the family living at Frilford Heath.

Does anyone have any information on the four on our memorial, or know of others that we should remember? If so, I would be delighted to have details so that I can put together a full record. I can be contacted at 27 Kings Avenue, at mikehoath@aol.com, or on 01865 391349. *MIKE HOATH*

Lord Woolton Pie

¹/₂ a large cauliflower
3 medium parsnips
3 large carrots
¹/₂lb potatoes
¹/₂ med swede
1 med onion
2 tsp of Marmite or a stock cube
1 tbsp of oatmeal
500 ml vegetable stock
METHOD

2 tsp bisto powder.
Salt and pepper to taste once cooked.
Parsley (fresh or dried)
For the pastry
80z plain flour
40z mashed potato - cooled
30z either margarine or lard or a mixture
2 tsp of baking powder
couple large pinches of salt
Dash of water if needed.

Use pre cooked vegetable stock (or a stock cube) and stir in the marmite. Chop up the vegetables into chunks with those that take longest to cook into smaller pieces. Place in pot with the oatmeal add the stock and just enough water to reach 3/4 of the way up the veg in the pot, bring to simmer .

Add salt and pepper and cook until tender and most of the water has been absorbed. Mix the bisto to a paste with a little water and add the pot. Simmer for a further 5 minutes. Place in your pie dish and sprinkle the chopped parsley over the top.

Leave to cool

Make the pastry by mixing the flour with the baking powder and salt and then rubbing in the fats. Mix the mashed potato in to form a dough and knead (add a little water to the mixture if too dry). Roll out to form pie crust and place on top of your vegetables, decorate then brush with milk.

Place in oven at 190°C Fan for 30 minutes or so until top is firm and browned. (you can make "crisps" by baking the peel with salt and flavouring eg paprika)

Rolled Oat Macaroons 3oz (85gm) margarine 2oz (55gm) sugar 4oz (115gm) S.R. flour 1 level teasp baking powder 4oz (115gm) rolled oats 1 teaspoon almond essence 2 dessertspoons of golden syrup. METHOD Set oven at 180°C Fan Cream together the margarine, sugar, syrup and almond essence.

Sift the flour and baking powder, add to the mixture with the rolled oats.

Mix thoroughly, if the mixture is too dry add a little milk just to bind the mixture together

Roll into 12-16 balls and put on a baking tray lined with parchment leaving a little space for spreading.

Bake for 15-20 minute until golden brown. Cool on baking tray before removing.

Dear Editor Marcham Walking

Those of us in Marcham who like to walk have been very fortunate. Not only do we have a number of footpaths and bridleways



but – thanks to the generosity of Manor Farm – for many years we have had the use of several excellent permissive paths.

However since 2013 the bridge over the Ock at the end of Mill Road has been closed and remains in need of repair. We are given to understand that no-one can afford to pay for the necessary repair work to be carried out. The loss of the bridleway over the Ock cuts us off from many paths and bridleways on the south side of the Ock. Since 2013 the number of us living here has grown substantially and – in the present circumstances – the need for more walking routes is greater than ever. Might the Parish Council consider approaching – inviting – other owners of land around Marcham to set up some additional temporary permissive paths – with restrictions on their use as required eg no cycling, no dogs? Perhaps – temporarily – some of the Stewardship Margins could be "re-purposed".

There is another public bridleway over the Ock. It starts just east of the south-east corner of Trendles Field (grid ref SU 446 062). Access though is hindered by a locked gate. The bridleway heads south over the Ock and then peters out very near to a track that goes east and leads to the paths we used to be able to reach by going over the Ock at the end of Mill Road. The southern end of the bridleway is just beyond our parish boundary. Nevertheless the Parish Council no doubt could contact the landowner and also if necessary the neighbouring parish with a view to linking the bridleway to the track. Such a route would benefit both parishes.



The multi-user games area (MUGA) lights are in place, building work on the hall is essentially complete and snagging/completion survey checks are under way. We still have work to finish on finalising lease agreements (nearly there) and arrangements for insurance, utilities and many other details need to be settled. Our committees are meeting by videoconference (we are becoming skilled at using Zoom) to keep project momentum going even during these strange lockdown times.



Those of you looking in at the field will have seen the large yellow/brown patches where the grass has been sprayed before topsoil is moved. We expect ground works to start before the end of April and they may even be underway by the time you read this.

We will keep you posted on when handover will occur, although we are clear that the new facilities will not be open for business until government CV-19 restrictions are lifted—that is likely to be still some time away yet.



Isolation, Adaptation and Covid-19

I'm writing this on day 12 of my own personal Covid-19 isolation. I'm informed my medication will make me vulnerable to the virus as it reduces my



immune system, and though I'm told I need to isolate for 90 days, it's likely to be a lot longer! Once the infection rate is reduced, I will still need to isolate to a degree, until the virus is brought under control and understood. So, in this shared experience I thought I'd try and set you an alphabetical nature challenge, to occupy some of your time. If you are able to get out into your garden or your local community for your daily exercise, or just looking out of the window, try and be aware of the nature you can see and discover.

Each day pick a letter and use that to engage and occupy yourself with nature for a while.

- A Awareness. Become aware of the nature around you.
- B Behind. Notice the nature that may be behind your shrubs and trees, or behind the plant on your windowsill.
- C Call. Become aware of the bird calls in your local area. Don't worry about identification, just enjoy the sound.
- D Do. Get you hands into nature by doing some weeding and remove dead leaves from your house plants. Nature is about touching it, not just seeing it.
- E Everywhere. Nature is everywhere, if we care to look.
- F Fly away. Look up to the sky and imagine for a while what it would be like to fly like a bird. See the world from above, the bigger picture.
- G Goldfinch. See if you can spot these lovely little birds. 30 years ago, it was a challenge, but these days they are more abundant.
- H Hear. Often, we just hear the birds when out in nature. What other natural sounds can be heard though?
- I Ignore. Ignore that inner voice that can offer up a negative narrative during times of crisis. Focus on the nature around you and know this won't last forever.
- J Joy. Take energy from the joy the trees, wind, birds and sky offers.

If you have any plants you would like donate, please label them and leave them by Sheila's gate.



- K Kite. In Oxfordshire, Red Kites are now a common sight. Look up, see if you can spot one.
- L Ladybird. Can you see any ladybirds?An absorbing pastime as they are often tucked away.
- M Mauve. Colour is a big thing out in nature, so try and find things that are mauve.
- N Numbers. What's your favourite bird species? How many other species can you see? The number of species can often be astounding.
- O Observe. Observe patterns of behaviour and habits going on out in nature.
- P Photography. Try and take a picture of the nature around you, that in itself wakes us up to what we've not noticed before.
- Q Question. Find something in nature that interests you, then question how much you really know about it. Try researching it and finding out something new.
- R Relax. During the isolation we need to relax, use all your senses to use the nature around you to relax.
- S Starling. Starlings aren't as common in gardens as they once were. They are great mimics though, so have a listen to their calls.
- T Try. It can be demoralising having our lives impacted by Covid-19, but keep trying to get through. Try and find one new thing in the nature around you that you've never seen before.
- U Unsure. Many people are unsure what the plants and animals actually are that surrounds them. Don't let that impact on your appreciation of it. We don't need to know what everything is all the time.
- V Value. Value everything out in nature, it all plays its part.
- W Weather. Enjoy the weather, whatever it is.
- X Xplore. Explore the nature you can see, hear, touch and smell etc.
- Y Yellow. Try and spot how may yellows you can see at this time.
- Z Zoom. Zoom in and have a close look at all the nature around you.

You may have other words to focus on for each letter, but you get the idea.


There will also be a range of garden plants at the double gates of 18 Frilford Road. Tomatoes will be available for sale from week commencing Monday, 27th April.

Neighbourhood Team Newsletter for Marcham Anti-social behaviour (ASB)



Anti-social behaviour (ASB): The neighbourhood team have been working in partnership with two local housing associations to tackle ASB in Abingdon. Recently, absolute possession was granted by the court for one property on the Vineyard and another at Southmoor Way, Abingdon. These possession orders follow months of work by officers on the neighbourhood team and demonstrate that reports of ASB are taken seriously and we will do our best to tackle and reduce these sorts of incidents.

There have been reports of drug use in the Carse Close area of Peachcroft. This is being closely monitored by PCSO Moquet.

Burglary: On Tuesday 24th March, a property on Bowyer Road, Abingdon was burgled. The victim was assaulted by being pushed inside her property, but was unhurt during the incident. Three offenders entered and searched the property before being chased away by the victim's neighbours.

An attempted burglary occurred on Saturday 7th March on Mill Road, Abingdon. The offender was disturbed by one of the occupants and did not steal anything from the property.

Offenders brought to justice

Following a report from a member of public, PCSO Selene Moquet identified a vehicle parked in the Peachcroft area that had no tax or MOT. Working with the on-duty Vale of White Horse CCTV operator and officers from the Abingdon Roads Policing department, the driver was stopped after the operator saw the driver leave the area in the vehicle. The vehicle was then seized by officers.

PCSO Selene Moquet and PCSO Adi Wright spotted a male using his mobile phone whilst driving. Information about the vehicle was passed over the police radio. A short time later, a Roads Policing officer caught up with the driver and he is facing a possible 6 points on his licence and a ± 300 fine.

Neighbourhood team engagement

Whilst the current situation surrounding the COVID-19 virus is unsettling and people may be feeling anxious about the social restrictions in place, the neighbourhood team will continue to police the community including spending time on foot patrol offering reassurance. The neighbourhood team have attended several incidents where people have been struggling with their mental health during the lockdown. If you need help and someone to talk to, speak to your GP, call 111 or contact a charity such as Mind. You could also consider the following:

- Keep in touch digitally make plans to video call people or groups that you would normally speak to.
- Keep a routine plan how you will spend your time and try to follow your ordinary routine as much as possible.
- Try to keep active build activity into your daily routine. This could include seated exercises or dancing at home.
- Get as much sunlight and fresh air as you can open a window or spend time in your garden if you have one.
- Find ways to spend your time including relaxing and being creative.
- Manage your fears write them down or talk them through with someone.
- Don't watch too much news distract yourself with another activity.

Unfortunately many of our planned engagement opportunities have not been able to take place over the last few weeks. However, the team have been out and about practising social distancing whilst on foot patrol. We have been supporting the local businesses that remain open, ensuring that people are polite and respectful to the key workers who are carrying out essential work during these difficult times.

COUNCILLORS' REPORT

Is there a bright side to COVID 19 emergency?

It seems almost impossible to avoid bad news at the moment. The daily diet of depressing and dire predictions for society, the UK and the world give very few grounds for optimism. As a result, it is very easy to feel gloomy and depressed.

But it isn't all bad news! There are some silver linings! We have all been learning some valuable lessons from the pandemic. Many potential opportunities are presenting themselves.

- Locally, we have discovered the vast number of caring volunteers in our communities prepared to give their time to make things better for the most vulnerable – we have found dozens of community organisers; we have seen great work being carried out by the church; we have found hundreds of food and medicine deliverers.
- Families are benefitting, as parents working from home have more time to be with their children. Many have become very creative in using their time well and discovering new talents in themselves, for example cooking.
- Air is less polluted as less traffic is on the roads and less aircraft are flying.
- People are becoming much more aware of nature the sound of birds is not drowned out by traffic and planes.
- Many people are finding that working from home is efficient and more productive. Perhaps this will change the way business works in the future.
- Councils are discovering how to use IT better to save money, save time and save the environment.
- Government is discovering that the people of this country have retained the ability to pull together and endure hardship and that things are often done best at a local level.
- Globally, there may well be opportunities to make a better, fairer, more united world.

Let's hope that, when it's all over, we make best use of the opportunities these extraordinary times are offering.



Marcham Covid-19 Hardship Fund

<u>What is this fund?</u> A generous donor has given some money to help those within the village or church in need during the Covid-19 pandemic. The fund will be administered by the Standing Committee of the Marcham with Garford PCC which will meet approximately every two weeks to review any applications.

<u>Who can apply?</u>This fund is available to any individual or family based in the parish or on the electoral roll of the church.

<u>What can I get funds for</u>?As this is a fast-moving and uncertain situation, each application will be considered on its own merits. It may be to help pay household bills, to pay for a week's shop or some other reason.

How do I apply? Please complete the online form on the church website under the 'Marcham Covid-19 fund' tab

<u>How soon will I hear whether my application has been successful?</u>The standing committee will aim to meet approximately every two weeks, so you should hear within a fortnight.

If I want to make a donation to the fund, can I do this? Yes - details can be found on the website



In collaboration with the local charity Sofea, Marcham Volunteers and All Saints' Church we are able to distribute food parcels to households in need in Marcham during the Covid-19 pandemic. These boxes will contain both perishable and nonperishable produce and will vary on a week to week basis. In order to receive food parcels, you will need to become a member of Sofea (this is free during the Covid-19 crisis but does require that you complete a form). To receive a box you ideally need to complete the online form on the church website or you can call Rachel on 07910 484 936 who will take your details and complete the form for you.
