

GOODBYE TO OXFORDSHIRE'S MILLENNIUM

Abingdon: the Time Tellers
Wednesday 19 December 6.30pm-7pm,
Abingdon market square.

In Abingdon, local history is retold in a son et lumiere spectacle, The Time Tellers, when the town square will be peopled with weird and wonderful puppets, a special soundtrack and some magical surprises at the end. Local schools and students have worked together with local artists to create the strange and magical sculptures that bring the shows to life. The show is produced by local company Pyrotheatrix, headed by Paul Batten.

Oxford: White Night

Friday 7 December 6pm-late, locations around Oxford city centre, with Symphonie Conique on Broad Street.

In Oxford, Symphonie Conique is part of White Night, when the city's galleries, theatres, museums and open spaces host a special late-night evening of art, music, dance and performance. White Night is a popular event in many cities across Europe and the county's millennium closing event creates a similar festive idea for Oxfordshire and a link with its European neighbours. White Night includes a chance to meet the Tudors at the Museum of Oxford; a ghost fest and ice sculptures at Oxford Castle; Nightfair before Christmas, a live art fair and entertainment in Gloucester Green produced by OVADA gallery; flambeaux, harpsicord and carols at the Ashmolean Museum; music in the foyer at Oxford Playhouse and late-night cabaret at the Burton Taylor theatre; the Pitt Rivers and Natural History Museum by torchlight plus community choirs and musicians; slam poetry at the Museum of the History of Science; and guided tours of Modern Art Oxford's current exhibitions with refreshments, music and conversation (with the Oxford Muse) in the café. Blackwell's bookshop will stay open late and there will be street performance along the culture trail. The Oxford Bus Company is also offering free travel for children under 15 years accompanied by an adult.

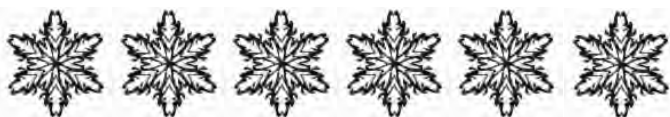
