From Marconi to Mars: a selected history of radio research in the UK - Dr Chris Davis and John Bradford, CCLRC Space Science and Technology

Pioneering radio research carried out at the Radio Research Station (RRS) at Ditton Park near Slough at the beginning of the last century led to the development of RADAR and continues to have a profound impact on our understanding of the world around us. This talk will follow the development of radio technology using photos and early experiments and look at scientific progress from the very earliest experiments in radio at the RRS through to current radio and space-based research which continues at the CCLRC Rutherford Appleton Laboratory. There will also be the chance to try out some of the early experiments for yourself

Have You Heard about South Oxfordshire Dial-a-Ride (SODAR)?

SODAR is a new door-to-door service for people in South Oxfordshire District who are unable to use, or who find it difficult to use, conventional public transport due to mobility difficulties.

It is available Mondays to Fridays between 10am and 3.30pm, and can be used to make journeys to the shops, leisure facilities, the dentist, the doctors and many other places.

It is open to all members. Membership is free of charge, and the fare for any journey is just £2 single or £4 return. South Oxfordshire District Council concessionary passes and tokens are accepted for use on the service.
