



Grants Reminder

The Parish Council considers any requests for grants at its November meeting. Grant requests are considered usually just once a year. Therefore, if there is any worthy and needy organisation where Marcham residents benefit which is considering applying to the Parish Council for a grant, then please use the application form available in the publications section, on the Council's website www.marchamparishcouncil.gov.uk, and enclose a copy of your organisation's accounts. The Council's grant policy too can also be found there. Details of where to send the application are on the form. The deadline for submissions is **15th October, 2019**. Applications received after that date or not on the application form will not be considered.

Trick or Treat - 31st October

Autumn is upon us, and it is approaching that time of year when children can be tempted into going out trick or treating. The Council would make its annual appeal by saying that normally it is a harmless pastime for children, but it can also be both frightening and intimidating. Much distress can be caused by unexpected knocks on the door or loud noises. Some residents may welcome trick or treating, others do not. If your children do go out, please encourage them to call only on those whom they know and to respect the wishes of anyone who does not wish to participate.

War Memorial improvements

The Council is considering tidying the base around the war memorial. This will include clearing unwanted bushes and growth such as ivy, temporarily removing the gravel to treat the ground, installing a sloped path, improving the flower beds and then renewing the membrane and gravel. It is currently looking for quotations for the works.

Parishioner of the Year Award

The Parish Council is again inviting nominations for the Parishioner of the Year Award. This is to recognise the efforts of local people from anywhere within the parish who have contributed to local community life. Marcham Parish covers the wide area from the A420 in the north to the River Ock in the South and from the A338 in the West across to and including most of Gozzards Ford in the East. The Council gives the award to anyone who, at any time, has significantly voluntarily contributed to life within the parish. The certificate is presented at the annual meeting for electors each year. Would anyone who wishes to submit a nomination please contact the clerk, whose details appear below, sending a short statement of not more than 200 words as to whom he/she wishes to nominate and the reasons why the person should receive the award.

P19/V2049/LB and P19/V2137/FUL Conversion of existing listed barn to new 3 bed detached dwelling at 12 Frilford Road. The Council commented on materials for the window, screening for parking, access off North Street, and landscaping.

P19/V2132/HH To erect a solid panel side and roof extension to the side and rear elevations at 21 Fettiplace Road. Council objected owing to the overdevelopment of the site, impact on the neighbouring property causing overlooking and loss of light..

Repeat of Information from September MADNews regarding road closures

North Street

The Parish Council has learned that Southern Gas Networks will be undertaking gas main reinforcement work at the Southern end of North Street for approximately one month between 7th October, 2019 and 8th November, 2019. The road closure will operate 24 hours a day. Access will be maintained for properties which are only accessible from the closed section of road, and for emergency services. Unfortunately the S8 and 15 bus services will not be able to serve the village during this time and will travel along the A415. Stagecoach is currently assessing whether there is need for additional temporary bus stops along the main road during this period.



A415

Following completion of the North Street works, Skanska, on behalf of the County Council, will be undertaking overnight resurfacing works in the A415 between 8.00 p.m.-6.00 a.m. This is planned for 8th November 2019 to 10th November 2019. So the A415 will be closed overnight for these two nights. The evening and night buses between 8.00 p.m. – 6.00 a.m. Oxford to Wantage will serve Howard Cornish Road, then Sheepstead Road, Faringdon Road past the Dog House Public House, then southwards along the A338 towards Wantage. The reverse route will be taken from Wantage to Oxford. It is anticipated that the A415 should be re-opened at 6.00a.m. on Sunday 10th November. From 10.45 - 12.15 approx the road will be closed again for the annual Remembrance Day parade.

MARCHAM PRE-SCHOOL

It always amazes me how quickly the children adjust and settle into preschool life each September! As I write this we're two weeks in and the children start each morning with a cheery hello and a huge grin



Our days are full of laughter and fun with a choice of activities set by the children, relating to their interests or fascinations.

In one morning alone, we covered buildings, houses, hospitals, MRI scanners, bones, skeletons and movements! This term we've introduced being a "Healthy Mover" and we're learning new physical skills each week. We started by moving 'treasure' (balls, quoits or beanbags) from hand to hand and passing them around our bodies.

We've also received some mini-skeletons and have been comparing to our own skeletons... how do the bones move? Which bones can you feel? What happens if a bone breaks? We made our own 'casts'!!

If you have a child of 4 or younger, we'd love you to get in touch to discuss your needs and secure your place at Marcham preschool. As a charity, not-for-profit organisation, we keep our fees as low as possible (£4.50 per hour for 3- and 4-year-olds, £5.50 per hour from 2 until the term after the child's 3rd birthday). We can offer places for funded 2 year olds plus the universal entitlement (15 hours per week) for all 3- and 4-year-olds and the extended entitlement of 30 hours for working families. Lots of activities have been available throughout the month but the most popular activity was the Monkey Puzzle Book by Julia Donaldson. This was created in our tough tray and the children spent hours exploring all their senses in our self-directed play using fine motor skills, cognitive development and their creativity. A great month – well done Preschool Room.

After School Club After the summer holidays we have all returned with lots of summer stories to share and to complement this the topic for this half term is 'countries'. 



Garden Ethics

I've been to visit 3 new potential clients, and they, in very different ways, got me thinking about how ethics are interwoven in how and why we garden.

The first client had a really old shed, that although falling apart, had still retained a lot of materials, in very good condition. Their challenge was whether it's cheaper to dismantle and dispose of the old shed, and then purchase and build a new one? Compared to, separating out all the saveable materials, and rebuilding a new shed out of what was left, by purchasing any missing materials?

The second client had an overgrown garden, still full of very nice plants. They were facing the conundrum of whether it was cheaper to have all the saveable plants dug up, and retained? Or if it was cheaper to just clear the whole site and buying a totally fresh batch of plants? My third client was playing with the age-old issue of, is it a better use of time and money to stop growing their own vegetables, and just take a trip to the local shop?

My conclusion is that worth and value is not just measured in monetary terms. It can also be measured in the carbon footprint, it can be measured against sustainability, it can be measured in the feelgood factor, in values, in ethics.

There's certainly no right or wrong conclusion around this, and if you were expecting one, sorry, I'm going to disappoint you!

We all have to make our own considered choices, some of us thinking about the wider impacts, others of us thinking about what's the most convenient, the most sensible option. The interpretation of 'sensible' is a whole other article!

Gardening is considered a simple pastime, career or even a burden. Yet simple conversations around the gardens I visit often lead me to deep consideration elsewhere.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Planning for the Future

Given all the current uncertainties around the immediate future of local government – Brexit, future funding, road building and congestion etc – it may seem an odd time to be worrying about long term planning. But current problems will, one way or the other, be resolved and it may be a perfect opportunity to pause and consider what sort of a world, country and county we want for the next generation and beyond.

Global warming and Climate Change have shot up the agenda partly because the science is looking alarming and partly because young people of all ages have added their voices to the volume of concern. We are told that if we do not set minimum/zero Carbon output targets for 2030, it may be too late to avoid catastrophe. If that is right, then the implications for Carbon output of everything we are planning should be at the top of every agenda.

Take the proposed **Oxford to Cambridge Expressway**, for example - 5-10 years to build with massive carbon output due to construction and likely additional traffic generated from the many homes needed to pay for its building.

Take the proposed **TW Reservoir** – 15 years to build – huge numbers of construction lorries – a projected 1m visitors a year –

again with massive implications for Carbon output.

To offset these two projects alone we would have to plant trees over the rest of the County. If both were to be given the green light, our chances of reaching our carbon targets look impossibly remote. Take **roadbuilding** in general. We are told that, within 10 years, we will all be driving electric vehicles. Within another 10 years it may be hydrogen fuelled and self-driven cars. A few years beyond that, car ownership itself may be consigned to history along with the need for all the extra roads we seem to be hell-bent on building. Take **housebuilding**. There is little excuse for not insisting that every home we build should aim to reduce its carbon output to an absolute minimum both in the building and once occupied.

Take public **transport** in general. Recent data suggests that many of our city buses are underoccupied. The volume of cars on the city roads is making many buses late. As a result, potential bus users are getting into their cars and adding to the congestion. It is a mad, mad world.

Trying to plan for the future in a fast-changing world is a complex and challenging business. By putting the Climate at the top of all other considerations, we may make better decisions and fewer mistakes..

**THE PROPOSED ABINGDON RESERVOIR:
AN UPDATE FROM GARD**

It may have gone a bit quiet but the mega reservoir proposal has not gone away!

We are currently awaiting the decision of the Secretary of State on the Thames Water and Affinity plans. We know that the regulators (Ofwat and the Environment Agency) are not convinced by their proposals. They have asked for a strategic study into water supply for the **whole of the South East** (including a possible reservoir, but also other schemes advocated by GARD), with completion for decision by 2022. Recently, the Secretary of State has approved both Severn-Trent's and South-East Water's plans. There has been no pronouncement on Thames Water's or Affinity's plans which seems to indicate that all are awaiting the outcome of the strategic study. GARD will urge that the research process is carefully monitored so that there is no possibility of TW involvement skewing the outcomes towards their preferred option.

As more and more local residents become aware of the reservoir proposal and GARD's part in campaigning against it, we have received many requests to summarise the case against the reservoir. A link to the factsheet is available on the GARD website, along with a map of the proposed 150 million cubic metre reservoir that will cover 4 square miles.

Dear Friends,
