

# MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL Annual Meeting of Electors

The Annual meeting of electors currently is scheduled to take place on Thursday 21st May, at 7.30p.m. in the school hall. The guest speaker this year is Mr. Tom McCullogh from Community First Oxfordshire, who will outline ways that communities can influence the planning of the area in which they live and work. The talk should provide a very interesting introduction to Neighbourhood Planning. However, please read the next issue of MAD News and check the Parish Council's website for the latest information, as it is possible that arrangements may have to change.

## Drayton Household Waste Recycling Centre

At the time of writing, the Drayton recycling centre will be closed on Tuesday 28th and Wednesday 29th April, 2020 to allow for cleaning and essential maintenance at the site, such as jet washing and repainting lines. This is part of the County Council's planned approach to maintenance, and is carried out annually in order to keep the site safe. If it is not possible to hold on to your waste until the site reopens, provided the County Council is keeping these sites functioning, the ones at Redbridge and Stanford in the Vale will be available.

# A420 Traffic - Meeting 6th March with David Johnston MP

Parish Councillor James Plumb attended a meeting of parishes representing areas along the A420. David Johnston MP was present and had attended to listen to concerns regarding the excessive volumes of traffic, excessive speed, unsafe conditions for pedestrians and cyclists, and road noise affecting properties. Marcham was particularly concerned with the diversion of traffic along the A415, and it was noted that the Police needed to reconsider diversion routes following accidents or road closures. There was a shared objective between the parishes regarding traffic and the problems with which we all identified.

David Johnston is tabling an Adjournment Debate which would enable him to speak on the issues of the A420 and require a minister to respond. see page 15.

# Faringdon Road and Gozzard Ford – Road Works and Closure

The County Council has informed the Parish Council that from 8.00p.m. – 6.00 p.m. from 3rd April for approximately 5 nights, the road from Gozzards Ford to the end of Barrow Lane will be closed to facilitate crack and joint sealing works. In addition from 17th April to 23rd April between 4.00a.m. – 6.00p.m. the road

nearer The Dog House public house will have restricted stopping and waiting owing to resurfacing works.

## Marcham Play Area

Currently the play area in the Anson field is closed as work to create the pitches progresses. This aspect of the work should be finished around mid April. Once the pitches are finished, fencing will be erected around them to ensure that they candevelop properly without disturbance. The access from Tower Close and the Southern side of the field will be restored, and the play area will be usuable again.

The Parish Council has not received any planning applications for consideration this month.




# Nearly there...but when will we be able to open?

The good news is that we are currently expecting a handover date for the new Marcham Village Hall in the last week of April. Building work on the new hall building and fitting of all internal installed equipment is essentially complete and construction of the MUGA is also nearly complete. Over the next few weeks, surveys will be carried out to identify any snagging issues that need to be resolved before handover. Our solicitor is working with the Parish Council solicitor to complete the lease agreements that we need to have in place for handover to occur. We will then be able to start our furnishing and fitting work.

The not-so good news is that we don't know if Covid-19 will impact on these final stages. We don't have control over the virus or government responses to the risks. We think it is highly unlikely that we will be able to open the hall to users groups for some time after we complete our fitting-out. The delay is likely to be many weeks or months as we are coming to realise. This is a community facility and we need to safeguard people as a high priority.



Large areas of the field have now been fenced off for ground work and grass-seeding on the new pitch areas, and access to the field is currently very limited to the small area in the north east corner accessible from Tower Close. We know that people are being patient over this period and we are grateful for your understanding.



We have had very good news on fund-raising for furniture and fittings. The Moonrakers concert raised a very welcome £1154—thank you again to all who came and supported the concert. Sponsor-a-brick, run by the village shop volunteers, has now reached a total of £3500. We are making a last push to make it to the target of £4000 before the hall opens—please help us do this, even in these difficult times! We would also like to get our 5p total up to 10,000—so check your pockets and purses and drop them off to Denise, please.

We were delighted to hear that our grant application in November to the National Lottery Community Fund was successful—they liked what we told them about our project and are funding our application in full! They have awarded us a grant of £9920 towards our furniture and fittings project, taking us much closer to our target. We have already received the cash in our bank account.

# CITIZENS ADVICE CAMPAIGNS HIT THE TARGET IN 2019

People often see Citizens Advice as a "quick fix" centre, rather like the garage that changes your car tyres – you pop into our office or ring Adviceline or you check the facts on our comprehensive website. But there's more to Citizens Advice than quick fixes.



"Research and Campaigns" (R and C)

is a part of Citizens Advice with a different task, a long-term one that demandsmuch effort and patience. It has the job of collecting evidence on emerging social problems and then directly petitioning the people or organizations - including ministers, local MPs and government departments - that have the power to solve or alleviate them.

These campaigns have been remarkably successful, often making use of the media to put their point across. In 2019 R and C contributed to the surge of action that led to the scrapping of tenant fees. It also submitted a "super-complaint" on the Loyalty Penalty, whereby long-standing customers in some services (e.g. insurance) often end up paying more than new customers for the same service. Noting the rise in demand for food vouchers, R and C highlighted the issue of pressure on household budgets because of slow payment schedules for Universal Credit. R and C also issues occasional publications such as "Putting the house in order", which described failings in the housing market.

## DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT Coronavirus or Covid-19

I think we have all been shocked by the speed with which this virulent virus is moving across the world from China and into our local communities, and we talk about little else. Every day the government is announcing new measures to try to control and contain the virus, to mitigate against its devastating effect on everybody's lives and to highlight how we can all protect our families, friends and ourselves from getting the virus. I am proud of the fact that the Vale were ahead of many councils by taking robust action on Monday 16th March and ordering "all staff who could" to work from home, and to use phone/video calls for individual meetings and to set up conference calls or Skype business calls for bigger meetings. In this way, the Vale is carrying on doing business as usual and it is prepared to put into action any new, clear and precise government dictates. I am copying some advice we councillors have received which you may find useful:

#### The Beacon and Cornerstone

As of today, we have cancelled all public events and activities taking place at the Beacon and Cornerstone until further notice. This is in light of the government advising people not to visit theatres, bars and other public places. We have also closed Nourish, the café at Cornerstone and The Coffee Shop at The Beacon. This is as a precaution and not because of any confirmed or suspected cases of COVID-19. From Tuesday, 18th March, we will be closing the centres to the public but will remain open for key staff (including tenants). We are currently implementing our business resilience and communications plans that we already had prepared to manage situations like this effectively. We will of course be offering credits or refunds for tickets and room bookings and will continue to pay casual staff as if it the centres were operating as normal. Once closed to the public, we'll arrange for the centres to be deep cleaned and ensure key staff have the means to be able to work from home if they can.

## **Planning applications**

Until further notice, Planning is moving to a paperless system and therefore will not be accepting paper applications, paper representations/comments. We will continue to accept applications online via the Planning Portal - www.planningportal.co.uk, and the public and consultees will still be able to comment on applications on our websites by searching the reference number for the application and using the comment now button. They can also email registration@southandvale.gov.uk

Anyone wishing to make a payment for an application should call our customer services team on 01235 422600.

## Taxi licensing

To respond to the latest government advice on social distancing, we have taken the decision to stop licensing appointments until further notice. Unfortunately, this means that we are unable to accept any renewals at this time, and licences may expire over the coming months. We are also not able to accept any new applications.

We will be offering appointments again as soon as we are able to. Taxi drivers and operators are asked to check the website for updates. **Waste collections** 

Our waste collections are currently running as normal. To help protect our crews and stop the virus spreading we are asking people to follow these guidelines from Public Health England about how to dispose of their waste if they suspect they may have the virus. This guidance states:

Personal waste (such as used tissues) and disposable cleaning cloths should be stored securely within disposable rubbish bags.

These bags should be placed into another bag, tied securely and kept separate from other waste. This should be put aside for at least 72 hours before being put in your usual external household waste bin. Other household waste can be disposed of as normal.

#### Land charges

We're asking residents to submit any searches electronically as will not be accepting any postal applications until further notice.

#### Community, parish and voluntary sector

We are working collectively with partners, the voluntary and community sector, and town and parish councils to assist with direct community support work. As time goes by and as our residents' needs increase, we will be increasing the number of staff focused on this area, which makes an important contribution to public welfare." #### COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

#### Water, water everywhere

(but not enough to drink if Thames Water are to be believed). Over the past 30 years, Thames Water (TW) have been arguing that, in the near future, we are going to be desperately short of water and much the best solution is a giant reservoir between Steventon, East Hanney, Drayton and Marcham. Indeed, if their predictions had been correct, we would have been facing severe drought many years ago.

To be fair (and I am struggling here), the population and global warming have been increasing steadily throughout that time and TW can argue that we need to be looking at the evidence of need yet again. But with TW's history of poor and somewhat alarmist predictions, it must be right to question their latest evidence via a public enquiry. There is evidence and science on both sides of the argument - evidence and science that needs to be argued in public.

With repeated Environment Agency flood warnings in recent months, and as I look out at muddy paths, sodden ground, full rivers and streams, with full and apparently merging lakes replacing gravel pits, drought hardly seems an immediate threat. TW and their reservoir surely have something to prove.

I confess I am not an angler or a sailor, but I can see that the recreational benefits of the reservoir are tempting. The potential nature conservation opportunity is also appealing - assuming that security issues do not forbid access to the reservoir area.

However, the overriding issue for me is undoubtedly the carbon output of building Europe's largest above ground reservoir over more than 10 years. Our chances of hitting our ambition to be Carbon neutral by 2050 would be very small if TW was to have its way. Add in large scale housing and road development and the chances are nill.

That is why I remain implacably opposed to the reservoir – at least until TW have demonstrated for the first time in 30 years that the case for need is overwhelming and there is no better solution



A partial closure order was obtained by the neighbourhood team for a property on Wilsham Road, Abingdon following reports of anti-social behaviour at the address. The closure order only allows permitted named people to be there, anyone found to be in breach of the order will be arrested.

**Burglary**: There has been an increase in reports of residential burglaries in both the inner and outer areas of Abingdon over the last month, including in Botley and Kennington. On most occasions, entry has been gained via the rear of the properties and jewellery has been targeted.

a private members' bill debate on a bill designed to cut the cost of school uniforms.

But as the month wore on, one issue began to take over. All of the meetings and events with external people at parliament ceased and we were advised to avoid public engagements. I am still conducting my surgery appointments, but by phone, rather than in person. And the high volume of email that we usually get on a whole multitude of subjects is now just on one subject. It is completely understandable that COVID-19 has taken over in this way as it is a global public health crisis the likes of which we have not seen. Rather than talk more about the nature of the virus and the actions we have to take – which you are hearing 24/7 on the news – I wanted to highlight 2 things which I hope are of interest at this time.

The first is the huge community response that has taken place. Spend a couple of minutes on Facebook and you will find lots of groups across the constituency that have sprung up to support their neighbours. Sometimes these have been set up by people like Gareth Clarke, Chair of the Residents Association at Great Western Park. At other times they work in partnership with charities, as is happening in Wantage with the Ray Collins Charitable Trust. One is being run by Sofea, using its established Community Larder programme. The Community Larder already provided a weekly grocery supply to 700 individuals and families, feeding up to 2000 people in Oxfordshire, as part of a membership which also provides additional support and discounts on things like utility bills. They've now repurposed their efforts to support those selfisolating as a result of COVID-19. These initiatives all need people who can make calls, make visits, drive, help package up supplies and, of course, donate. Please help if you can.

The second thing I wanted to highlight is Open University's free to use learning platform, **OpenLearn**. It has over 15,000 hours of online courses to help people improve their knowledge and skills. Given so many of us are going to be spending a lot more time at home, I thought a break from the news would be welcome.
