**REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 9TH NOVEMBER. ROAD CLOSURE: A415** FRILFORD ROAD & CHURCH STREET, **NEW ROAD.** 

The Parish Council has applied to the Vale of White Horse District Council for a Road Closure Order on Sunday 9th November, to close New Road, Church St, and the section of the A415 between North St and Church St between 10.45a.m. and 12.15p.m. This is to permit wreaths to be laid after the service in Church. There will be minimal disruption to bus services, and the road will not necessarily be closed for the full duration of the Order. The diversion route will be Sheepstead Road, Faringdon Road and the A338 for the short period of the closure.

#### **OXFORD CONGESTION CHARGES** - WITH EFFECT FROM WED. 29TH **OCTOBER, 2025**

The Charging Zones in Oxford city commence on Wednesday 29th October, 2025. Various types of Congestion Charge permits are available for travel through these zones. These are available for residents, hospital visits, blue badge holders, carers etc. Others may be exempt. Marcham residents are entitled to apply for a free permit which permits travel through the zones on 25 days each year. #### **SALVATION ARMY TEXTILE BANK** Please stop fly tipping

The village is becoming more and more unsightly as people just dump bags on the ground next to the textile bank, and seem not to care, as their waste becomes someone else's problem. Dumping by the textile bank, expecting the Salvation Army to clear the rubbish, stops other textile banks from being emptied. The Salvation Army does clear away everything when they visit, and helps to tidy the area, but the van soon becomes full. Please leave textiles only, (but not duvets and pillows) putting them in small bags in the chute, or loose in the chute in the textile bank.

If the fly tipping continues, the Parish Council may consider requesting the Salvation Army to remove the bank. The legitimate textiles do raise vital funds for the charity, so please use the Marcham bank responsibly. Other clothes recycling banks are at Millets Farm, or Tesco Extra, Marcham Road. #### **GARDEN WASTE**

For those who have purchased a permit for a brown wheelie bin for garden waste, you can put out a maximum of four additional sacks of garden waste next to your bin for the collection on Wednesday. 5th November. Please use only refuse style sacks no larger than 60 litres. (One tonne builders type waste bags will not be collected). Any bag or container must be left open so the crew can easily empty them and be able to check the contents.

All the garden waste collected will be taken to a facility near Wallingford where it is composted. The compost is then sold on to local farmers for use on their farmland as a soil conditioner.

Again, the annual reminder for those of you who may have purchased fireworks and intend letting them off in your garden, please be considerate for neighbours, the many pets, animals, and wildlife in the village. please notify others when any

fireworks are going to be lit so that villagers are aware and arrangements can be made to keep pets indoors.






A massive Thank you to all those who have helped run the pack, the parents that have volunteered and all the Cubs past and present, without you the pack would not have been as successful as it was.

#### MARCHAM PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

What a busy and exciting term it's been here at Marcham CE Primary School. From building robots to celebrating harvest, we've been taking exciting opportunities to develop our learning and enrich our experiences.



#### **MUSIC FLOOD**

Term started with us being involved in Music Flood Week, a joint venture with some Abingdon Schools and Radley College. From singing to musical instruments, artwork inspired by music and a rap written by Meerkats (Year 4), it was a week to celebrate music. The children took part in workshops and saw a selection of musical instruments being played by pupils of Radley College. Reception and Key Stage 1 all participated in a singing workshop, learning new songs and developing their musical knowledge (pitch and dynamics). Key Stage 2 took part in a workshop from the ensemble group Doikayt, playing the accordion, clarinet, and violin with Yiddish inspired songs.

#### **LEGO ROBOTICS**

With thanks to Amazon, who finance outreach activities developing STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics. Our Wolves (Y5&6) class started the day by competing in a worldwide Coding competition, programming characters on an iPad to score goals around obstacles. Our Meerkats (Year 4) and Giraffes (Y5&6) classrooms then turned into robotics labs. Working in pairs, we built and programmed Lego robots to complete a range of challenges — including trying to visit six parts of a map using only one set of code! It was amazing to see how quickly everyone picked up coding and problem-solving.

#### **RUGBY DAY**

MUSIC AT THE UNICORN

Everyone from Reception to Year 6 got stuck in (sometimes literally!) during a rugby taster session. We practised passing, dodging and scoring tries with the help of Grove Rugby Club coaches. We all had fun, learned some new skills and the importance of teamwork





#### HARVEST FESTIVAL

Our Harvest Festival took place outside on the school field which included a wonderful celebration of everything we are thankful for. Each class prepared a song or poem about autumn and harvest time. In keeping with our value of Friendship and Community, families donated a large amount of food which we took to Abingdon food bank, Giraffes (Year 5&6) shared some key information about how much food is needed in our local area. A big thank you to all the families who contributed — your kindness will help many local people in need of a helping hand.

The start of term has been full of learning, laughter, and community spirit. We're proud of all our pupils for their creativity, kindness and enthusiasm and are looking forward to continuing this throughout the year.



#### **RUGBY**

The Red Roses (England's female rugby union team) won the World Cup at the end of September, beating Canada by a healthy 33-13. The Red Roses have not lost a game for 33 matches (a world record), won the World Cup on three occasions (1994, 2014, 2025) and been runners up on six occasions. #### **CRICKET**





Where do these winds come from? Meteorologists will say things like 'pressure systems' and 'Arctic fronts', but we all know the truth: they're summoned by ancient

#### **DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT**

Residents will have read in my previous reports that the Vale (together with South Oxfordshire) has been working for some years on a new Joint Local Plan (JLP). Not only would this 'lock in' the housing growth already committed to over a longer time period and so give the much-needed infrastructure time to catch up, but it also proposed greater allocation to affordable housing and measures to improve energy efficiency and nature recovery.



The Planning Inspectors held the Stage 1 Examination of the JLP in early June and everything appeared to be progressing fairly smoothly: some minor requests for clarification, but nothing out of the ordinary. It therefore came as a huge disappointment when the Inspectors wrote in late September to request that we withdraw the JLP. Their rationale for this was over a single issue: a perceived failure to meet the 'duty to cooperate' with Oxford City Council (OCiC) over housing numbers in the districts to make up for Oxford's 'unmet need'. OCiC was itself recently forced to withdraw its own Local Plan from examination over the duty to cooperate with neighbouring councils, including South & Vale. Looking further afield, there has been an unusually high rate of Local Plans being forced to withdraw across the country in the past year or so.

South & Vale responded to the Inspectors' request for withdrawal in a robust letter detailing what we perceive to be errors in their rationale: use of outdated terms and contradictions with Inspectors' decisions made during the OCiC Local Plan examination. While we await the Inspectors' response, it was also interesting to see a recent letter from the Minister of State for Housing and Planning to the Chief Executive of the Planning Inspectorate, emphasising the need for Local Plans and urging an appropriate level of flexibility. At time of writing, I'm afraid the likely outcome of all of this is unclear to me. We are in unchartered territory and there appear to be nation-wide trends in effect. However, South & Vale's officers and councillors, including myself, are doing our utmost to achieve the best result in the circumstances. On the positive side, even if we do withdraw the JLP then we should not see an increase in 'speculative' planning applications being approved, since the Vale has a solid 5-Year Housing Land Supply and our current Local Plan

# is still valid for several years. I promise updates when I have them! **CLLR DR ROBERT CLEGG**

#### COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Depending on when you read this, the new Congestion Charge Scheme in Oxford will either have already started, or be about to start, on Wednesday 29th October. As I've mentioned previously, this is not a scheme I support but one that I feel residents need to be as informed as possible about.

At a base level, everyone living in the area that I represent on the County Council will qualify for an Oxfordshire Area Permit, meaning that residents can apply for a free permit that gives you 25



day passes for travel through the six Congestion Charge zones in Oxford, allowing you to avoid the £5 charge. Additional permits are available for certain groups including Blue Badge holders, unpaid carers, community health and care workers, mobile traders and patients required to attend frequent hospital appointments in the Oxford area, so do be sure to check whether you are eligible for additional permits.

Residents can now apply for Congestion Charge permits online by registering for a free online account, selecting the permit you're eligible for and uploading the required documents. Unfortunately,

the online portal isn't the most user friendly, so if residents have any questions about the process, please do drop me an email and I'll do my best to assist you in completing the application. For more information on the scheme and to apply for a permit, please visit the County Council website here: www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/transport-and-travel/oxfords-temporary-congestion-charge-cars/congestion-charge-permits

On another note, earlier this year the County Council announced new plans to clear every highway drainage gully across the county on a yearly basis, as part of improved efforts to tackle issues like flooding. Gullies and drains in Marcham and surrounding areas should have now received their first clearance as part of this scheme. If you notice any drains or gullies that haven't been cleared, please do email me or report them on FixMyStreet, so I can try to get them cleared before we move into the Winter months. As always, a big thank you to residents who continue to raise issues with me, however big or small. #### MP'S REPORT

#### **SESRO UPDATE**

Thames Water's Statutory Consultation on SESRO was scheduled to start on 28th October and goes on until 13th January 2026. There will be a series of public information events. You can find out more information about the consultation process here: https://thames-sro.co.uk/projects/sesro/

Further significant questions have been raised because the significant increase



in the estimated cost of the project. I was pleased to see that Vale District councillors have again challenged the project. I will continue to work with GARD and local councillors to challenge the proposals.

#### LODGE HILL

I am continuing to work closely with stakeholders at Oxfordshire County Council and Balfour Beatty to ensure that construction at Lodge Hill remains on track. At a recent on-site briefing, engineers shared that they are working to ensure that any disruption is as minimal as possible, as the project enters its second phase. I was encouraged to hear of Balfour Beatty's commitment to community benefit projects in the local area. I hope that this development of this new junction will greatly improve traffic flow in and around Abingdon and ease pressure at the Marcham Interchange.

#### **FLOOD MITIGATION**

Over recent months, my team and I have met with a number of local stakeholders, councillors and residents regarding flooding across Oxfordshire, particularly at-risk areas like Marcham. With wetter winters becoming the norm, protecting our local rivers and streams has never been more important. I welcomed the introduction of an emergency flood barrier for South Abingdon earlier this year. I would like to see greater investment in mitigation strategies for communities across the area. Please rest assured that I will continue pressing the Government to deliver better flood defences to areas most at risk.

#### **PALESTINE**

Many will be greatly heartened by the news of a permanent ceasefire in Palestine. The talk of an enduring and lasting peace is encouraging, but true peace will only come with the creation of an independent Palestinian state. Over the past few months, I've spoken in the media about why recognition matters. The UK's decision earlier this year to formally recognise the State of Palestine was long overdue – a small but vital step towards a just two-state solution. Being present for the opening ceremony of the new Palestinian Embassy in London felt like a real moment of hope.

Recognition alone is not enough. We must now ensure it leads to real change: the release of all hostages, unrestricted humanitarian access, and the rebuilding of Gaza's shattered communities. I will keep working to maintain the pressure for a peace that delivers dignity and security for both Palestinians and Israelis.
